## Health and safety risk assessment checklist

## Cleaning

When answering these questions, you should consider whether there are any factors in your working environment that impact absenteeism due to sickness in your workplace. If you identify any health and safety problems that can contribute to absenteeism due to sickness (e.g. occupational accidents), you should include them in your considerations when prioritising and drawing up an action plan.

Do employees strain their bodies in the same way over long periods, e.g. due to working with mops, vacuum cleaners or wiping down furniture and repeating the same motion over a long time?				
Heavy lifting	Yes	No		
Do employees lift sacks of waste, laundry, salt, buckets of water, chemical cans, foil rolls or heavy furniture?				
Pulling and pushing	Yes	No		
Do employees exert a lot of physical effort when pulling or pushing rolling containers, waste containers, trolleys, furniture, etc.?				
Wet or damp hands	Yes	No		
Do employees work with wet or damp hands for more than 2 hours a day?				
Hazardous substances and materials	Yes	No		
Do employees work with hazard-labelled products such as cleaning, washing, detergent and disinfectant agents?

Is there a risk of employees being exposed to dust that contains hazardous substances, or do employees work with gloves made from natural rubber, which can cause allergies?				
Large workload, time pressure and unclear requirements	Yes	No		
Are employees often too busy or assigned too many tasks at work?				
Help and support from management and colleagues	Yes	No		
Do employees need help and support from management and colleagues?				
Offensive behaviour	Yes	No		
Has anybody at the workplace been subjected to bullying, sexual harassment, discrimination or any other offensive acts by management or their colleagues?				
Acute and excessive physical load	Yes	No		
Is there a risk of employees acutely overloading their bodies, e.g. when lifting bags of laundry or pulling/ pushing rolling containers, waste containers, trolleys or furniture?				

Falling and stumbling  Is there a risk of employees falling or stumbling over clutter, goods, etc. on the floors of the facilities where they clean, or due to slippery floors or outdoor surfaces during the winter?	Yes	No
Fall to lower level  Is there a risk of employees falling from ladders, work platforms, etc.?	Yes	No
Indoor climate  Is there a bad indoor climate in the places employees have to clean?	Yes	No
